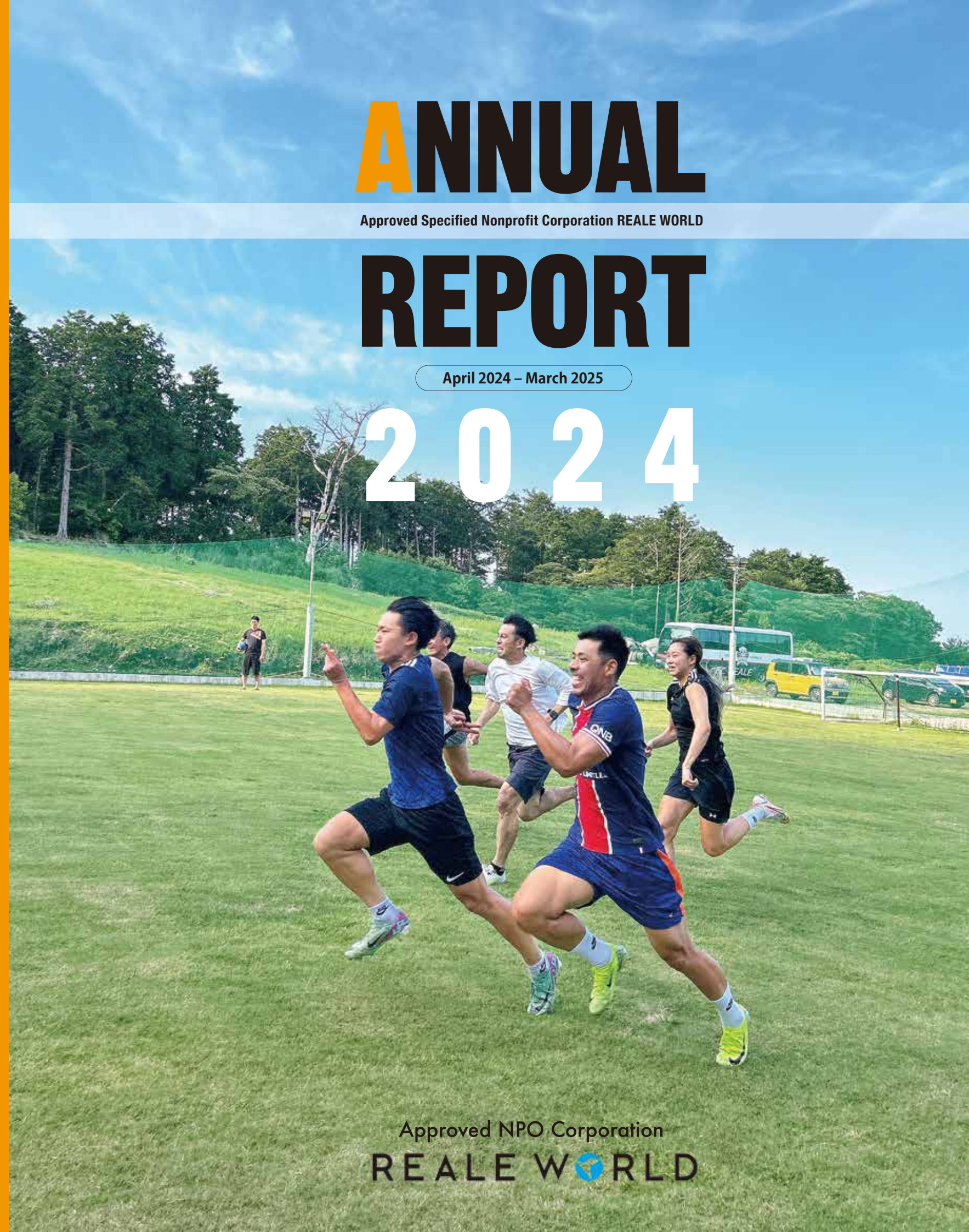

# MY FOOTBALL KIT PROGRAM

## Unlocking Children's Potential! "MY FOOTBALL KIT" Experience in Nepal

Starting in August 2024, we launched hands-on programs in Nepal using the "MY FOOTBALL KIT," a DIY-style soccer ball. This kit has received great feedback from children, who enjoy the fun of building, the satisfaction of completing it, and the joy of playing with a ball they made themselves. Through the process of trial and error with their mates, they naturally develop ability to think, communicate, and a spirit of cooperation. In FY2024, the program was held at 8 different locations, including schools near Kathmandu, public schools and soccer clubs in rural areas. Teachers and local adults also enthusiastically joined the events, making for joyful, surprising, and educational experiences.

In Japan, three volleyball clinics were held at Kaida Jr. High School and Kisomachi Jr. High School. In Nepal, three more were conducted for club teams that include national team players.

The instructor was Kazumi Nakamura, an Olympian who shared key lessons such as "Awareness makes all the difference" and "The importance of persistence." Through her personal journey and insights, she nurtured the hearts and minds of youth.

# BORUSSIA CAMP with REALE

## FC REALE U-11 achieves 3rd place in an International Tournament in Spain! A Summer of Challenge and Fair Play on the Global Stage

In June 2024, the FC REALE U-11 participated in the international soccer tournament "Copa Catalonia" hosted by KOMM MIT INTERNATIONAL. 145 teams gathered from around the world—a grand stage for young players.

For many of them, it was their first experience abroad. They faced numerous challenges, from jet lag and heat to unfamiliar local foods and long flights. Yet, they faced all these new experiences head-on and played with confidence.

As a result, they earned a remarkable 3rd place finish. Moreover, awarded the prestigious "Fair Play Award"—granted to only one team among all 145—recognizing their exemplary manners on and off the pitch and their active efforts to interact with players from other countries.

# COFFEE PROJECT

**A cup of good coffee creates hope. Every sip helps protect the environment and support children's futures.**

**T**hrough the import and sale of “Him Café,” a coffee grown in Nepal, this project creates jobs for small-scale farmers and women in vulnerable situations. Profits from these activities are used to provide soccer shoes and create environments that nurture dreams for children in developing countries. To help people connect “drinking coffee” with “making a difference,” student volunteers promoted the project at school festivals and local markets across Japan in 2024. The grower, the roaster, the seller, the giver, and the one who takes a sip— each cup of coffee connects people across the world, and begins the day with a smile.

# Kaida Highlands Farming Experience Project

Weekly sessions from July to September

## Regional Issues and Youth Self-Discovery A farming experience project in a hidden mountain village, supported by the Kiso Town Office.

**H**eld in the Kaida Highlands of Kiso Town, Nagano Prefecture, this project offers a hands-on agricultural experience where young people can broaden their horizons through local engagement. Participants take on real farming work, experiencing firsthand the challenges facing Japan's agricultural sector—such as aging populations and labor shortages. They also engage in discussions with town officials, deepening their understanding and reflecting on possible solutions. At the same time, this project contributes to revitalizing the region by nurturing “related populations”—people with ties to the area. It serves as a meaningful bridge between urban youth and rural communities, offering insight into sustainable living.

## REALE Money Seminar Discovering Your Own Path in Life—Inspired by a Conversation About Money

**F**rom April 2024 to March 2025, we held the REALE Money Seminar across 12 sessions throughout the year. The series provided participants with the opportunity to pause and reflect on their lives, dreams, and values—through the lens of money. Many people carry silent doubts or anxieties about money, unsure of whom to ask. This seminar created a safe space to explore those questions, offering perspectives and practical insights to help dissolve mental blocks and overcome real-world barriers. Money is one of the essential elements in turning our dreams into reality. Through these sessions, many participants gained a new awareness of how they relate to money—and found the courage to take a step toward a life that feels more true to themselves.

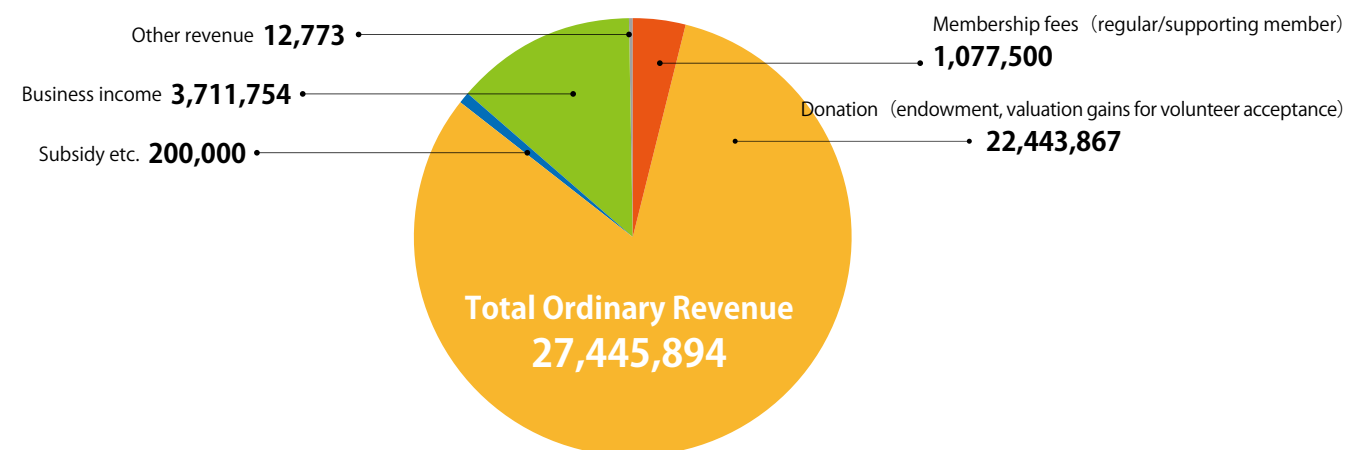
